Thanks for the additional information! To access all the years for this table, go to American Factfinder > Advanced Search. In the Refine your search results box, under Topic or table name, type in S1701, then click Go. On the right, you'll want to click ?Geographies? and under Select Geography Type, select Metropolitan Statistical Area/Micropolitan Statistical Area - 310. You can then select to view all of the Metropolitan Statistical Areas in the U.S., or you can manually select just the cities that appear in this first table. Add it to your selection and then close that pop up window. You can then select the ACS 1-year estimates going back to 2005.

Hopefully this helps and let me know if you have any further questions or if you need additional assistance.
